School readiness is much more than memorizing facts and figures — it's knowledge application, innovation, creative thinking, and a positive disposition for learning. To ensure quality, we completed our fifth nationwide survey of parents and teachers to assess their views of the preparedness of Bright Horizons graduates. In our most recent survey, parents and teachers of more than 1,000 Bright Horizons graduates were contacted during the fall of their child's kindergarten or first grade year.

Teachers' Perspective

Elementary school teachers who participated in the survey provided insight into both the most important factors required for a child to succeed in elementary school and the preparedness of Bright Horizons graduates specifically.

One kindergarten teacher reported, "Some parents overestimate the need for children to come in with the ability to read, write, and count. My job is to teach students how to do those things. I am more concerned that they come in knowing how to treat other children, how to treat teachers, how to work cooperatively, how to play with others, how to share, etc."

Another teacher commented on graduates' ability to expand on their education. "Filling out a worksheet or a workbook isn't always knowing a subject matter. I like to see how children apply what they are learning."

Parents' Perspective

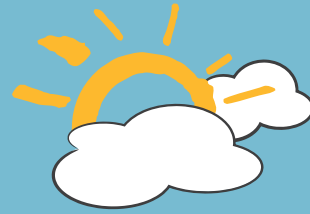
Today's parents have high expectations for achievement and want to ensure that their children enter school ready to meet or exceed academic expectations. These parents overwhelmingly told us that their child's Bright Horizons experience met their high expectations.

According to the Partnership for 21st Century Learning, learning and innovation skills are increasingly being recognized as the skills that separate students who are prepared for the ever-evolving, complex life and work environments of the 21st century, from those who are not. A focus on creativity, critical thinking, communication, and collaboration is essential to prepare students for the future.

More than 97% of parents agreed that their Bright Horizons graduates entered elementary school prepared for the emerging 21st century world, with the ability to:

- Collaborate by making friends and demonstrating genuine respect for others
- Think critically by approaching a challenge in an innovative and creative manner
- Communicate by sharing information and feelings as well as speak in a group
